QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Does the NLPS have a Business Plan? Why or why not?

ANSWER- Gary Norman, Director

Submission of a very detailed Business Plan outlining the goals of the NLPS and a definitive plan of how to get there was a requirement of the Department of Fisheries and Oceans. Writing the plan took many hours and a lot of hard work. This is a living document which is updated and changed as circumstances change. Today's plan varies greatly from one written three or four years ago.

Our plan discusses the history of our Light and the important role it played in Collingwood's history.

The DFO asked about community awareness, community support, community involvement and support from various levels of government. We discuss our media exposure, our many successful community events, donations from individuals and local businesses, our busy volunteers, as well as our growing membership list. We have included letters of support from both government leaders and important donors who have pledged continued financial support.

A detailed financial plan indicating how we intend to raise substantial funds for restoration once ownership is a reality, is included. When we have ownership of our beloved Light, our business plan will be an important part of our presentation to potential donors, as well as our applications for grants from government and foundations.

We outline what the NLPS has achieved so far and our plans moving ahead which include obtaining ownership, steps for restoration, ways to financially sustain our Light over the years as an important tourist destination.
