ROBERT SQUARE - Vice-Chair, Government Liaison

With an affinity for the water, Robert's passion for lighthouses has grown since his first visit to the Cove Island Lightstation in the late 1980's. When the last lightkeeper departed in November 1991, leaving the lightstation to the ravages of nature, he was saddened by the deterioration that was occurring. Robert then



formed the Cove Island Lightstation Heritage to *"Preserve the Legacy and the Lore for Future Generations" of* Canadians.

Robert has become an advocate for the preservation and protection of Canada's lighthouses. He has travelled across the country as a member of the committee that developed and campaigned for the passage of the Heritage Lighthouse Protection Act, making presentations to heritage groups, a committee of the House of Commons and the Senate on the urgency of protecting Canada's lighthouses. On the passage of the Act, Robert was one of the advisors to the Historic Sites and Monument Board on the implementation of the Act and development of heritage criteria.

In 2015 he was a founding member and Chair of the *Nottawasaga Lighthouse Preservation Society (NLPS)* and was responsible for obtaining Incorporation & charitable status. He currently leads the negotiating team for the transfer of the Nottawasaga lighthouse from the Government of Canada to the NLPS. Robert is an irreplaceable force on our team. We all rely on his knowledge, experience and negotiating skills.

When the Algonquin Scouts who were posted at look-outs along the river observed Iroquois raiding parties approaching, they would pass along the word Nottawasaga meaning "Iroquois at the mouth of the river".

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION - Why are memberships to the Nottawasaga Lighthouse Preservation Society free? Aren't you missing out on needed funds? **ANSWER** - written by Nancy Leno and Gary Norman When the NLPS was first incorporated in 2015, the membership fee was set at \$25. The purpose of this was to generate a cash flow to help pay for the initial expenses that were incurred in setting up the organization. As time went on, however, it became difficult to maintain the base as people often failed to renew their affiliation and so the membership dropped from 200 to 125. An interested supporter suggested we offer free memberships. It had worked for a group he belonged to. He said that this would attract more people to our cause. It would also show any level of Government from whom we might be seeking assistance, our level of community support. He pointed out; it is better to have one or two thousand free members than 125 paid. He was right! Our


