We are maintaining a positive relationship with the Saugeen Ojibway Nation (SON). Our Chair, Stephen Emo, Vice Chair, Robert Square & Secretary, Pat Anstett travelled to Neyaashiingmiing, ON near Wiarton at the beginning of July for a meeting with Chief Greg Nadjiwon, Ryan Lauzon, Fisheries Biologist, & two Counsellors Miptoon (Tony) Chegahno and Sydney Nadjiwon. The Chief told us that they were reasonable people that want to work with us and not against us. They are concerned about the fish habitat and suggested using a floating dock that could be removed during spawning & at other times when we didn't want people on the island such as during restoration. There is a large feeder population for white fish which is important for their own food. They are concerned about the contaminated soil getting spread into the waters. These concerns are our concerns as well. They hope we would incorporate some of their history into the island & lighthouse. A further visit to the island is planned in early September.
